Annual Jackson County Plastic Round-up

Jackson County Recycling Partnership hosts an annual event with drop-off locations for numerous types of plastic, including grocery and dry cleaning bags, cereal and chip bags, to-go containers, lawn furniture, toys, nursery pots, buckets, CD's and cassettes, agricultural plastics, buckets and much more. Year-round outlets for plastic

Bottles

- Rogue Disposal & Recycling: Table Rock depot and curbside program
- Recology Ashland Sanitary Service: Water Street & Valley View depots, and curbside program
- Southern Oregon Sanitation: Eagle Point depot and curbside program

Tubs

- Recology Ashland Sanitary Service: Water Street and Valley View depots and curbside program

Nursery plastics – trays and pots

- Grange Co-op: Drop-off at any store location

Shrink wrap, bubble wrap and clear film

***Never place in curbside or depot commingle bins! Clean, dry material only.*

- Rogue Disposal & Recycling: Table Rock depot
- Recology Ashland Sanitary Service: Water Street depot ONLY (not accepted at Valley View)
- Southern Oregon Sanitation: Eagle Point depot
- Allied Environmental Services: Drop off at White City location

Grocery bags/plastic bags

***Never place in curbside or depot commingle bins! Clean, dry material only.*

- Recology Ashland Sanitary & Recycling: Water Street Depot ONLY
- Southern Oregon Sanitation: Eagle Point Depot
- Allied Environmental Services: Drop off at White City location
- Grocery/big-box stores: Some stores accept shopping bags (i.e. Safeway, Fred Meyer); check with your favorite shopping outlets to learn if they offer bag recycling

Bird seed, grass seed and grain seed bags

- Grange Co-op: Drop-off at any store location; woven polypropylene bags

Commercial / non-residential collection of volume – misc plastic

- Allied Environmental Services – provides free collection for volume
- SPARC Enterprises – drop-off volume plastic to Grants Pass location; contact in advance
- Rogue Disposal and Recycling – contact for volume shrink wrap, clear film and bubble wrap

Waste Prevention Ideas

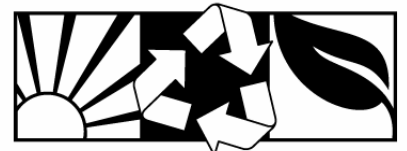
Reduce waste and change buying habits

- Buy durable, quality goods that last: "Buy it right, or buy it twice." When buying appliances, electronics, etc. choose reputable products/companies.
- Use a refillable water bottle or coffee mug; stop purchasing one-time-use bottles and other containers.
- Avoid to-go foods. When packing a lunch for school or work, use reusable containers.
- Avoid disposables: Don't buy products manufactured for automatic disposal such as razors, plastic plates, utensils, etc.
- Buy bulk: Bring your own containers and bags with you to the grocery store.
- Seek products that have less packaging; store brands, generic foods are often less packaged than others.
- Buy recycled: Close the loop and help build healthy recycling markets by purchasing items made with recycled content.
- Buy local: Local goods require far less resources for shipping, storage, etc.
- Buy used: Instead of buying new, seek second-hand items from Craig's List, The Nickel, thrift stores, etc.
- Don't buy: Rent or borrow items that you will use infrequently, such as trailers, camping equipment, lawn care equipment, tables and chairs, ladders, power tools and dishware.
- Reuse shopping bags. Tell the cashier you don't need a bag.
- Purchase music online using MP3 technology instead of CDs.
- Repair and mend things, don't discard them.
- When you no longer need items, share them with a neighbor or give them to charity.
